Historic South End Parking Study



Rapid revitalization in Charlotte's Historic South End district has brought a range of parking related challenges along with economic success. In a study initiated by the business community, Nelson\Nygaard conducted a space inventory and demand analysis, assessed stakeholder perspectives, and reviewed peer cities with effective and innovative policies and actions. The planning team then outlined a range of parking management measures in the form of a "Parking Toolbox" that would address present and future parking challenges as the district continues to evolve into a unique urban destination.

Recommendations included a brokerage service to facilitate the sharing of parking, the introduction of strategic parking rate structures, and in-lieu fees to fund public garages and general transportation improvements.
