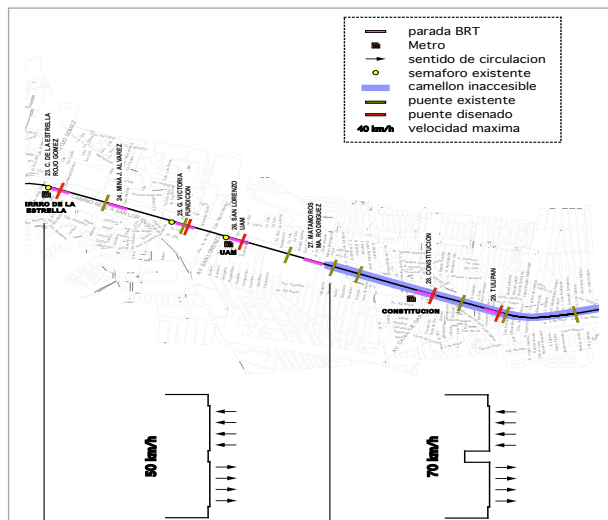
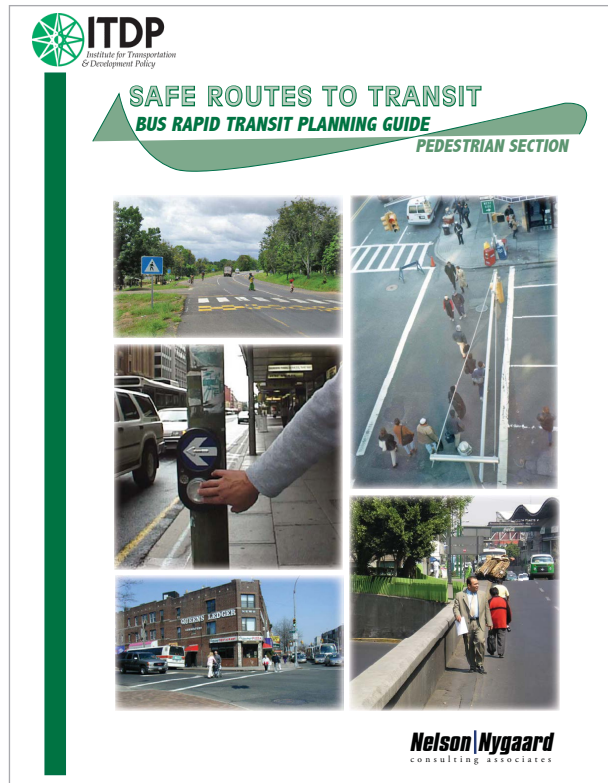
Nelson\Nygaard provides policy, design and technical support for sustainable transport all over the globe. We have worked in large urban areas in countries from Thailand to Tanzania, India to Indonesia. We have presented at conferences sponsored by the United Nations, European Union and Brazilian Ministry of Cities.

### Training Manuals

Nelson\Nygaard has contributed to two international non-motorized transport planning and design training manuals. *Preserving and Expanding the Role of Nonmotorised Transport* (2004), published by the Sustainable Urban Transport Project ([www.sutp.org](http://www.sutp.org)), covers benefits, regulations, planning, implementation, and resources. The second is an update and expansion of the Pedestrian Section of the *SUTP Bus Rapid Transit Planning Guide*. The work was funded by the Hewlett Foundation and the World Bank's Global Environment Facility. We have published this section independently as *Safe Routes to Transit*.

### Non-Motorized Transport Projects

Nelson\Nygaard has worked on transportation projects around the developing world including pedestrian safety, pedestrianization, bicycle facilities, traffic calming, and bus rapid transit (BRT). Typically an assignment involves site visits and documentation, research, sketch solutions for specific locations, a presentation and a report. In Guangzhou, China we contributed to the *Pedestrian Plan* (2001) and continue to assist with pedestrian access to stations along their third Metro line. In Mexico City we analyzed the proposed Eje 8 BRT corridor and helped convince the government that the system was flawed. Also in Mexico we provided specific design recommendations for problematic intersections along the recently opened Insurgentes BRT corridor. In Cartagena, Colombia we provided design guidelines for pedestrian and bicycle facilities in their proposed BRT system.
